LARGE ATTENDANCE AT THE FUNERAL OF J. BRECKENRIDGE

The funeral of John Breckenridge, the contractor, took place yesterday afternoon and was one of the largest ever held in Calgary, there being a very large attendance of friends of the deceased, both from the city and outside points.

LIGHTNING CALCULATOR CANNOT READ OR WRITE

Paris, June 2.—A doctor at an asylum at Nanton has found among his patients a "lightning calculator" who although he can scarcely read and cannot write, solves mental arithmetic problems involving large numbers.

Asked "How many seconds are there in 39 years, three months and twelve hours?" he gave the correct answer in 32 seconds. Explaining how he calculated the number of seconds in 39 years, he said:

"I know by heart that there are 31,536,000 seconds in a year. I multiply 30,000,000 by 39. That gives me 900,000,000. Then I multiply 1,000,000 by 30, and get 45,000,000; 30,000 by 30, which gives 900,000; and 4,000 by 30, giving 120,000. I add all these products and get 946,080,000 seconds in 39 years." This answer was given in 14 seconds.

MRS. PANKHURST GOES BACK TO HUNGER STRIKE

London, June 2.—Mrs. Emmeline Pankhurst, the militant suffragette leader, who was released from Holloway jail on license owing to the serious condition of her health arising from her "hunger strike," was rearrested today when she was leaving the house she was occupying in London.

The house of commons passed a new law this year known as the "cat and mouse" bill, permitting the prison authorities to release suffragettes suffering from the effects of "hunger strike" and at the end of a short period to rearrest them without warrant and make them serve the remainder of their original sentence. Mrs. Pankhurst's license was revoked on Monday, and it was then extended in consequence of her feeble condition.

Daniels at Newport.

Newport, R.I., June 2.—Secretary of the Navy Daniels arrived at Newport today to attend the opening of the Naval War College. During his stay efforts will be made to impress on Mr. Daniels the feasibility and advisability of the proposed day as a naval base and location for a monster navy yard. He will be extensively entertained by congressmen and the navy of Rhode Island during his stay.
