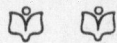

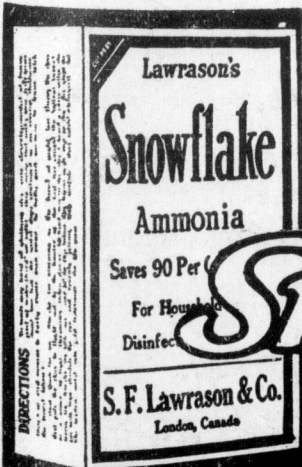

Mrs. Edith Jackson and Mrs. Tdna Parker are quite indisposed.

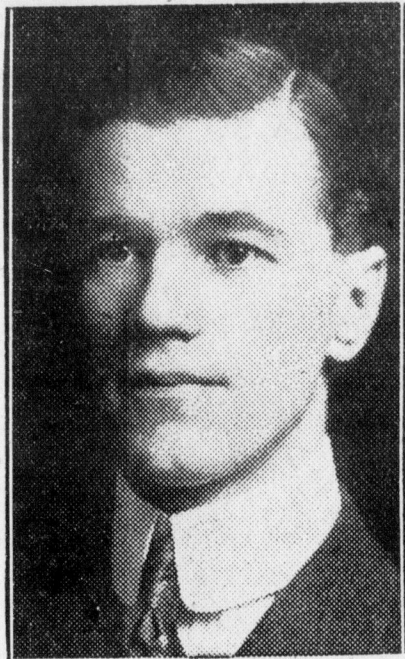
Madam E. Day has sold out her hair-dressing business and is getting ready to leave the city.
