WINTER ASSIZES OPEN WITH ONE CRIMINAL CASE

London City Hall Clerks Investigate Plans For Union

ASSIZES ARE OPENED AT COURTHOUSE

Only One Criminal Case Set
Down When Justice Mounts Bench.

MAY BE TRAVERSED.

Three Men Faced Trial For
Lives at Court of Year Ago.

When the winter assizes opened a year ago at the court house before Mr. Justice Lennox, three men were on trial for their lives.

This afternoon when Mr. Justice Rose mounted the bench at the court house, there was but one criminal case, that of John Blake, charged with the theft of \$150 from his employers, Vacuette, Limited.

The matter was sent to the grand jury for decision, although Blake was not in court, not having been located by officials.

Crown Attorney Inid is asking that the case be traversed until the next court.

There are four jury cases and 20 non-jury cases set down for trial, and it is expected that some twenty or more will be asked in a number of the actions.

Howard Cliff is asking that the \$10,000 damage action of Murray Leigh against the Benson-Wilcox Co. and members of the firm be traversed as well as the non-jury action of Robert E. Walker vs. Arthur Quinton, a mortgage agreement.

A year ago the court house was closely guarded by county, provincial and city police. A double jury panel was summoned, 95 in all. To day there was no special guard and interest was not keen in any of the cases.

Mr. Justice Rose began his address to the grand jury shortly after 2:30 o'clock.

ALLEGED CONFESSION IS ACCEPTED IN TRIAL

H. D. Williams Charged in
Fredericton With Murder
of Two Nieces.

Fredericton, N.S., Jan. 26.—(Testimony of Claude Peck, containing the alleged confession made when he was arrested, was submitted as evidence at Saturday afternoon trial of Harry D. Williams, charged with the murder of Cynthia and Neeta Foster last November, despite the opposition of Fred Peters, counsel for the defence.

Mr. Peters said he planned to introduce evidence in support of an insanity plea Monday. The only fresh evidence heard Saturday was from a brother of the dead girls, who testified that on the day of the murder the accused had gone to the girls' home and asked that they go to his camp that afternoon.

FIRE IN MONTREAL CAUSES LOSS TOTALLING \$100,000

Montreal, Jan. 26.—Fire swept four business premises in the east end of the city last night and caused damage estimated at nearly \$100,000. The fire started in the premises of the Laval University bookbinders and spread with great rapidity to two other stores. Adjoining the stores was a moving picture theatre, where five hundred persons were witnessing a performance, and when smoke began pouring into the show the spectators made a hurried exit without anyone suffering injuries.

HAY-BECK WEDDING FRIDAY ATTRACTS WIDE ATTENTION



Miss Marion Beck Will Be Married in Toronto on Friday.

NOTED HORSEWOMAN

Skill and Daring Won Admiration of Hundreds at Exhibition.

Toronto, Jan. 26.—Despite the fact that both principals have expressed the wish that their marriage be of a very quiet nature, widespread interest has been aroused over the wedding of Miss Marion Beck, only child of Sir Adam Beck and the late Lady Beck of London, to Mr. Strathern Hay, son of Mr. John D. Hay, St. George street, Toronto, which is to take place here on Friday afternoon next.

The ceremony is to be performed by Rev. Stuart Parker, D.D., in the presence of only immediate friends of the bride and groom. In St. Andrew's Presbyterian church, King street, Toronto. No special decorations have been arranged for the wedding, although the church has been reserved for the occasion.

As an exponent of horsemanship, Miss Beck is known in almost every show ring on the continent, although she reached her twenty-first birthday only last week. During the local show season in conjunction with the recent Royal winter fair, the popular daughter of the hydro knight, put several of her own and other mounts over the difficult jumps faultlessly. On an evening towards the close of the competition she had the mount on a large gray horse that was inclined to be nervous of the crowds that gathered to watch the performance. She was riding in the pair hunting class against the best in the land, including four officers of the Royal Canadian Dragoons, from Stanley Barracks, the first jump was taken without the loss of a point, but the applause rather alarmed her mount and he shied at the next obstacle. Many another rider would have been unseated, but Miss Beck wheeled the gray and sent him at the jump again. Once more he faltered, swerving at a sharp angle. It was the expectation of the thousands watching the performance that Miss Beck would give the horse his way on that particular jump, but not she. Once more the big gray was wheeled and sent at the jump. This time the spurs were applied generously, and the big fellow cleared without a hitch. Points were lost, of course, but the bride of Friday next demonstrated that she had a stronger will power than the little gray beast beneath her.

Announced Informally.

Miss Beck's engagement to Mr. Hay was announced here informally about three weeks ago, and Miss Beck has since been a guest of Mrs. Hay's. No elaborate entertainment has followed, and the entire wedding arrangements are to be on the same quiet scale.

Mr. Hay, who is in his 27th year, was a cadet at Royal military college, Kingston, when the war broke out in 1914. He then abandoned his studies to enlist with the Canadian field artillery as a gunner, and won his commission in service in France. He is now a member of the bond firm of Cochran, Hay & Co. He is a nephew of the late Sir John Hendrie.

Although it was first arranged to have a military funeral for the late colonel, the impossible condition of the roads in London township made this form of burial impossible, and a Masonic funeral was arranged.

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
