THE AYR SINK HOLE.

Down in Dunbricks township is a road that skirts a lake and which is difficult to maintain owing to the action of the water on the road material. For years money has been freely expended in an effort to find a material which would resist the action of the water and make a safe roadway, but without success. In County Council parlance the strip is known as the "sink-hole." This year's Council recommended that the sink-hole be abandoned, and that a new highway around the sink-hole be purchased, which can be done at a cost of \$75, said cost to be borne jointly by Waterloo and Brant counties. This proposal will strike the average man as a good plan, yet strange to say the ratepayers in the neighborhood of Ayr are opposed to it. They want the county to fill the sink-hole, which is a sort of bottomless pit. Why, it is difficult to understand, unless it be that the famous sink-hole is the only thing of its kind in Dunbricks, and the fear that were it circumvented the ratepayers would see no members of the County Council from one year's end to another. Too much has already been expended on the roadway in question, and the public will endorse the proposition to build a new road around it.
