THE POPE REFUSED TO SEE ROOSEVELT.

Ex-President Would Not Be Bound by Certain Restrictions.

PERSONAL MATTER.

ROME, April 3.—The audience which was believed ex-President Roosevelt would have with the Pope on Tuesday next, will not occur, owing to conditions which the Vatican has imposed and which Mr. Roosevelt refuses to accept.

Although the definite negotiations relative to the audience ended before Mr. Roosevelt left Egypt, the arrangement was withheld until after Mr. Roosevelt reached Rome tonight, at the solicitation of his American Catholic friends here, who believed that in the meantime the Vatican might change its attitude.

One of the former president's American friends, who was with him in Egypt, came to Rome yesterday without, however, any authorization from Mr. Roosevelt, and interceded with Cardinal Merry del Val, the papal secretary, in an endeavor to avoid a situation which, as it stands, has caused a real sensation in Rome, although it was not entirely unexpected. But his efforts were unavailing.

While at Gondokoro, in February last, Mr. Roosevelt wrote to Ambassador Latham saying that he would be glad of the honor of an audience with King Victor Emmanuel and the Pope. The audience with the king was promptly arranged. Before an arrangement could be reached with the Pope, several telegrams were passed, and the negotiations ended by Mr. Roosevelt refusing in any way to be limited as to his conduct, and announcing that an audience with the Pope, under the circumstances, was now impossible.

As a matter of fact, Mr. Roosevelt, although declining to accept any conditions in connection with his audience with the Pope, has neither directly or indirectly before, during or after the negotiations, made or considered any engagements in Rome except those of an official character, and he actually entered Rome tonight with but two definite engagements: the audience with the king, and the dinner to be given in his honor by the municipality.

LAYMEN'S MISSIONARY MOVEMENT

Series of Meetings in Maritime Provinces Covering Fourteen Cities.

The ocean to ocean campaign of the Laymen's Missionary Movement is to be concluded with a series of Maritime Conventions in New Brunswick and Nova Scotia, reaching fourteen important cities in seventeen days.

The Western Provinces were visited by a delegation of business men and secretaries last October and November, beginning at Winnipeg, October 20th, and reaching Victoria.

The points to be reached in the East are as follows:—April 3, 4, 5, St. John's; 5, 6, Moncton; 6, 7, Fredericton and Campbellton; 7, 8, Woodstock; 10, 11, Halifax; 12, 13, Truro and Kenville; 14, 15, Sydney Mines and Charlottetown; 17, 18, Glace Bay and St. John's; 19, 20, Sydney; 20, 21, Amherst.

The following speakers will participate in the Convention, though it will be impossible for any one of them to visit all of the points named:—The Bishop of Fredericton, Canon L. Norman Tucker, Toronto; R. H. Buchanan, Esq., and James Rodger, Esq., of Montreal; Judge Thomas of St. John; Rev. G. R. Martell, of Windsor, N. S.; Rev. W. T. Stuchlik, D. D., Rev. W. A. Manning of Toronto, and General Secretary Caskey of the Canadian Council.

Other speakers from St. John, Halifax and Sydney will assist at one or more of the Conventions. The programme at each point will be the same, the dinner being held the first evening, the second day being marked by conferences on difficulties and methods, and closing with a Denominational Conference led by the Laymen's Secretaries. Towns where Conventions are not held are expected to send delegates to the nearest Convention centres, in order to carry the enthusiasm back to their own churches.

IMMIGRANTS FOR CANADA

Seventeen Trains on Route to Montreal From Halifax and St. John

HALIFAX, April 2.—The streets of Halifax were dotted with new settlers yesterday, who arrived by the Coniston and are on their way west. Seventeen special trains from Halifax and St. John are due in Montreal with over six thousand immigrants. This big rush ending the biggest week in the immigration line that Canada has had for a good many years, over twelve thousand settlers having reached this country during the week. In this party there were six special trains from the Empire or Britain and several other boats, while six special leaders with immigrants are going over the Intercolonial and the Grand Trunk.

Most of the settlers are bound for the far west. That they are well laden with supplies is shown by the fact that the C. P. R. had to send 1000 wagons to St. John to take care of the effects of the people coming in over that line. Included in the party are thirty families, completing about 150 people, who are going to Calgary to take up farms under Sir Thomas Shaughnessy's latest scheme of "ready made" farms for settlers in the irrigation country.

Not a few immigrants are bound for Halifax, each train averaging ten cars, have passed through Moncton within 24 hours. Three of the west via St. John, and two via the North Shore.—Transcript.

THREE GERMAN AERONAUTS KILLED.

After Wild Flight Big Balloon Fell into the Baltic Sea.

HAD BAD START.

STETTIN, Germany, Ap. 3.—The German balloon Pommern which made an ascent here this afternoon, met with a series of accidents which ended in a disaster under most tragic circumstances in the Baltic Sea. Three men lost their lives, including the Radical member of the Reichstag, Werner Hugo del Bruock, Herr del Bruock and another member of the party was drowned, a third occupant of the car was picked up unconscious and died from his injuries, while the fourth was rescued in a serious condition.

The Pommern, carrying del Bruock who was acting as pilot, a banker, Herr Semmelhardt, an architect, Herr Benduhn, and a man named Hein, ascended early in the afternoon at the gas works. The wind at the time was blowing a hurricane, and the Pommern broke away before she had been completely inflated.

A chapter of accidents began immediately. The balloon collided with telegraph wires, which broke, almost overturning the basket. It then dashed into the roof of a neighboring factory, destroying the smokestack. With the basket swaying wildly, and held by its ropes cut, the balloon soared to a great altitude and disappeared in the clouds at a terrific speed.

The remains of one-looker, including a detachment of military, which had assisted in the ascent, ran along the roads, expecting the basket to break away. The balloon, however, was not seen again until it reached Swinemunde, thirty six miles northwest of Stettin, over which it passed at a height of 6,000 feet in the direction of the sea. Tugs followed in its track, and one of them which had out directly under it, was almost directly under it, when suddenly the balloon fell into the sea. The tug steamed to the spot quickly, but the rescue work was abandoned. Already del Bruock and Semmelhardt and Hein were clinging to the ropes and they were dragged aboard the vessel.

Hein died soon after being taken on board the tug and del Bruock's body was washed ashore this evening.

The Pommern with the aeronaut Oscar Eschmann in command, disappeared from the International Balloon race at St. Louis in 1907.
