Shall Toronto, the Queen City of the West, lag, behind Hamilton in this respect? The World srusts not; and with a view of further directing the attention of the citizens to this subject publishes the subjoined interesting contribution to the literature of the question. The April number of The Quarterly Journal of Inebriety, published under the ampices of the American Association for the Cure of Inebriates, and edited by Dr. T. D. Crothers, Hartford, Comm., contains an article entitled, "Inquiry as to the Desirability of Establishing an Inebriate Asylum in Toronto for Chronic Cases of Inebriety."

The author is Dr. C. S. Elliot of Toron and the article test consists of extracts from the report which Dr. Elliot presented to the City Council. The article gives the charac-teristics of dipsomania and describes the two principal forms in which the disease appears, the periodic and the chronic.

The periodic and the chronic.

The periodic is often observed in individuals whe have suffered from injuries to the head and spinal cord, from falls, blows, etc., brain shocks, from fear, grief, ioy or any great excitement of any kind, great strains and drains on the body and mind; also those who are the victims of hereditary taint, being frequently derived from a parent addicted to drink or one who is predisposed or addicted to insanity. The individual afflicted with this phase of the disease abstains for weeks and months from all The individual afflicted with this phase of the disease abstains for weeks and months from all stimulants, and not unfrequently loathes them for the same period. But by degrees he becomes uneasy, istless and depressed; he feels incapable of application; he is restless and at last begins to drink until he is intoxicated. Awakening from a profound or restless sleep he seeks again to repeat the intoxicating dose, and continues the same course for a week or two longer, when a stage of apathy or depression follows during which he feels a loathing for stimulants, is the prey of remorse and regrets bitterly the yielding to his malady. This is followed by fresh vigor, diligent application to business, and a determined resolution never again to give way; but, alas! sooner or later the paroxysm recurs and the same scene is reenacted. Uttimately, unless the disease is checked, he falls a victim to the physical effects of intemperance, becomes maniacal or imbeelle, or is afflicted with some form

Dr. Elliot then briefly describes the secon chronic form of the malady, as follows: The patient has incessantly the most over-whelming desire for stimulants; he disregards overy impediment; sacrifices comfort and reputation; withstands all claims of affection; consigns his wife and family to misery and disgrace, and denies himself the common necessaries of life to gratify his insane propensity. In the morning morose and fretful; disgusted with himself, and dissatisfied with all around him; weak and tremulous lincapable of any exertion of mind or body; his first feeling is a desire for stimulants, with every fresh dose of which he recovers a certain degree of vigor both of body and mind until he feels comparatively comfortable; a few days perhaps pass without are feeling being so strong; if soon returns.

From the above Dr. Elliot deduces that the great characteristic of the dipomaniac is an irresistible impulse by which he is impelled to gratify his propensity, being during the paroxysms regardless of life, health, family ties, affection or responsibilities; and during the interval the moral and intellectual percentioning to observe the property of the proper

the interval the moral and intellectual perceptions are so obscured that he no longer recognizes right from wrong, he no longer distinguishes wice from virtue or truth from falsehood.

The Doctor then treats of the physical aspect of inebriety. This, he says, is rapidly gaining ground. It is only within a very few years that the subject has been made one of systematic study and research. On this subject he pertinently observes:

old prejudices and notions are hard to over-eque, but to every intelligent and educated parses the notion that an individual whose mind is confused, whose nervous system is shattered, whose brain is concested, whose stomach is inflamed, whose muscles are en-feebled as the result of alcoholic indulgence, needs no treatment to restore the broken con-stitution, must appear absurd indeed.

Notwithstanding all the efforts put forth in the temperance movement the number of inebriates steadily increases. The number of alcoholic insbriates in the United States is estimated at one per cent. of the whole population. Taking this at fifty millions, this would give an army of five hundred thousand inebriates. "Large as the figures seem," remarks the Doctor, "there is every reason to believe that they are even larger in proportion to pepulation in this fair Dominion of ours."

The Doctor notes with thankfulness that hope is again dawning for this unfortunate class. There never was a time when the subject of inebriety met with such profound attention. From thousands of homes and tens of thousands of voices in Canada there is a cry for help. The need of special medical care in special surroundings is being recognized in all directions. It is safe to predict, asserts Dr. Elliot, that not far away in the future inebriety will be regarded as smallpox cases are, not with loathing so much as with sympathy and pity; the metriate will be placed in quarantine and treated for his malady till he recovers.
