Scientific and Aseful.

To keep cheese from moulding rub the cut part with butter, or cover the cut with jam paper. This will keep the cheese dry.

TAKE small pieces of old newspapers after being wet and sprinkle them over the car-pet before sweeping. This plan is better than using tea leaves.

STALE buns may be made to taste as nicely as when fresh, if they are dipped a moment or so in cold water, then put into a hot oven for five or ten minutes. They will turn out as light and crisp as when first baked.

LAUREL leaves ought never to be used in cookery as they contain prussic acid, and are, therefore, poisonous. The ill-effects would not be experienced unless used largely, but it is better always to use bay leaves in their stead.

THERE should be water plants in the glass globe in which gold and silver fish are kept, and the water should not be very fre quently changed. Very fine bread-crumbs, flies, worms and dried and powered yolk of eggs may be given to fishes in very small quantities.

CHEESE pudding is made by grating half pound of cheese very fine, mix with two eggs, whites and yolks beaten up together and half an ounce of fresh butter, season well with the property of t with pepper and salt. Bake in a small dish lined wi' i puff paste, or else merely butter the dish before pouring in the mixture.

GRAHAM PUFFS .- Graham puffs for break fast are richer and a great deal nicer than the last are refer and a great deal neer than the plain gem; take one pint of sweet milk, one pint of graham flour, half a teaspoonful of salt, and one egg, beat the egg, then add the milk, and then the flour gradually, beat it very briskly for four or five minutes, then pour into buttered gem pans; bake in a hot oven

Make a short sweet ened pie crust, roll thin and partly bake in sheets: before it is quite done take from the oven, cut in squares of four inches or so, take up two diagonal corners and pinch together, which makes them basket-shaped now fill with whipped cream or white of egg, or both, well sweetened and flavoured, and return to the oven for a few minutes. return to the oven for a few minutes.

Serve with a little grayy under them.
