THE FENIAN RAID.

OFFICIAL DISPATCH FROM THE SECRETARY FOR WAR.

The Lieutenant General commanding her Majesty's forces in Canada, has great pleasure in publishing in general orders the fol lowing extracts of a despatch he has re-ceived from the Secretary of State for war:

I am directed to express to you the satisfaction of Her Majesty's Government on the complete success which has attended the measures taken by you in conjunction with the Government of the Dominion for the re pressing of the inroads of Fenian brigands into Canada.

While entirely approving the judicious ar rangements made for giving the support of Her Majesty's regular troops at those points where, if the affair had been more serious, that support would have been most effective and most valuable, Mr. Cardwell is particularly gratified by observing that the actual resistance to, and successful discomfiture of, the marauders has been due to the gallantry of the forces of the Dominion.

Her Majesty highly appreciates the promptitude which the loyal and industrious in-habitants of the Dominion, at the call of their Government, and at such sacrifice to

themselves, left their occupations to range themselves under your command, and the vigor with which they repelled the wanton outrage directed against their country.
