CANADIANS TO ATTEND UNESCO CONFERENCE

The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Paul Martin, announced this morning the composition of the Canadian Delegation to the Fourteenth Session of the General Conference of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (Unesco) which will open at the Organization's Headquarters in Paris today. The Conference will end November 30, 1966.

The Chairman of the Delegation will be Dr. Henry D. Hicks, President of Dalhousie University, Halifax, and President of the Canadian National Commission for Unesco. The Vice-Chairman will be Mr. Graham McInnes, Canadian Permanent Delegate to Unesco, Paris. The other members of the Delegation will be:
