Mr. Fleming (Eglinton), a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, delivered a Message from the Deputy of His Excellency the Governor General, which was read by Mr. Speaker, as follows:

The Governor General transmits to the House of Commons Further Supplementary Estimates (1) of sums required for the service of Canada for the year ending on the 31st March, 1959, and, in accordance with the provisions of "The British North America Act, 1867", the Governor General recommends these Estimates to the House of Commons.
