I am dismayed, indeed I despair when I see the terrible record of under-achievement written into our history during the Trudeau years.

The leader of the NDP, speaking in this debate, spoke of the failure of this government's policies to date, concluding therefore that a much bolder step should have been taken. In his words, "the government did not have sufficient guts and imagination to pour at least another \$1 billion into the economy as it could and should have done". If he supports this government, where are his guts?
