POSTAGE STAMPS

Question No. 271—**Mr. Herbert:**

What is the estimated cost per dollar of sales to sell postage stamps (a) over the counter (b) by vending machines?

Hon. John A. Fraser (Postmaster General and Minister of the Environment): (a) The national average cost of selling a dollar of postage stamps over a counter in staff offices and postal stations is estimated to be 55 cents. (b) The present estimated cost of selling stamps through stamp vending machines is 30 cents for every dollar of revenue.
