

Philadelphia, Feb. 16.—Fourteen years' labor by two score noted American scholars, representing an outlay of \$400,000, is apparently to be thrown away, because Lippincott's Dictionary of the English Language, which was to have been a monumental work exceeding the great Murray's in scope, has suddenly been abandoned for lack of enough money to carry it to completion.

**PRINCE ARTHUR'S TOUR IN TORONTO ON APRIL 20.**

When Prince Arthur of Connaught arrives at Ottawa from the Pacific coast about April 15, the Grand Trunk will place at his disposal a special train for his use while visiting points in Ontario and Quebec, which will be a model of elegance and comfort. The expected date of his arrival in Toronto is April 20.

**FUEL OIL MARKET EXPANDING.**

British Admiralty Declares for Fuel Oil.  
A few days ago the telegraph announced the decision of the British admiralty to accept crude petroleum as fuel in all of the ships of the navy. The admiralty has been experimenting with fuel oil for several years past, and its decision proves conclusively that it has found it to be more economical than coal for steaming purposes, and that its storage in the hull of a ship is equally as safe otherwise the change would not have been made. Storage oil tanks are therefore, to be erected at all of the British naval stations, which will brighten the outlook for the fuel oil industry.

**CONTINENTAL LIFE INSURANCE CO.**

Attention is drawn to the annual report of the Continental Life Insurance Company for 1905. During the year 112 policies aggregating \$3,311,115 of insurance were issued, and the insurance force on December 31, 1905, was nearly four and a half million dollars, a net gain of nearly half a million dollars for the year. The Continental has increased the net reserve for insurance and life annuity by \$75,446.02, and which reserve now amounts to \$47,788, according to Dominion government standard. The surplus to policyholders has also been increased to \$146,638.02, besides the company claim safety in the new capital and premium thereon amounting to nearly one million dollars, showing a total surplus to policyholders of \$1,140,626.40.
