Will Never Hold a Consistory, Says U. S. Archbishop.

New York, Sept. 4.—Archbishop John J. Keane of Dubuque, Ia., who has just returned from France, today said: "Pope Pius was practically forced on the papal throne. He did not wish to take the responsibility. He will not live long. He does not want to. In my opinion he will never hold a consistory, and the outlook for the creation of an American cardinal is not encouraging."

HAMILTON HAPPENINGS

TWO ARBITRATORS NAMED CAN'T AGREE ON THE THIRD

William Warren, South African Veteran, Given Send-Off by Fellow Church Workers.

Hamilton, Sept. 4.—(Special.)—William Bell and Adam Studholme, the arbitrators chosen by the Street Railway Company and the men, have not yet been able to select a third arbitrator. They had a session today, but were unable to agree. They will make another effort Wednesday to make a choice. Many names have been submitted to them by the men and the company.

Thomas Roberts, 104 West Jackson-street, an aged man, who wandered away from his home yesterday to the great anxiety of his family, was found today on the Stone-road, near Dundas.

This afternoon the firemen were called to Hugh Hayes' tailor shop, 344 King-street, by a fire among some rags and paper. Little damage was done. One of the horses attached to the steam fire engine fell at the corner of King and James-streets while responding to the alarm and caused some excitement for a few minutes.

William Warren, a South African veteran, who will leave in a few days with his wife for the west, was given a send-off this evening by the Sherman-avenue Presbyterians, among whom he acted as Sunday school superintendent. He was presented with an address and a purse.

Street Names Changed. This morning Judge Snider approved of the following change in street names: Little William to Birge-street, Mountain-avenue in East Hamilton to Poplar-avenue, Hannan to Charlton-avenue, Cline-street to Wright-avenue, Hamilton-avenue to Biggar-avenue, Ellen to Windsor-street, Ida-street to DeLaware-avenue, Arkland to Mountwood-avenue, Tiarah-street to Glenferna-avenue, and several other minor changes.
