

HIGHLANDERS AS MARKSMEN

Over Two Hundred Men Turned Up at the Long Branch Ranges at Annual Meeting.

WEATHER FINE FOR SHOOTING.

Major Orchard Wins the Extra Series Aggregate—Pte. J. C. Smith Wins the General.

The ninth annual rifle match of the 48th Regiment, Highlanders, was held on Saturday at the Long Branch rifle ranges, and was by long odds the most successful in the history of the rifle corps. The outlook for shooting in the morning was very poor, as it rained with a steady downpour until noon, but the Highlanders are not of the tin-soldier type, and they decided to go on with the match, rain or shine. The elements favored them in the end, for it turned out to be a fine afternoon for shooting. The light was clear, the sky was overcast. The temperature was all that could be wished and there was not a breath of air stirring. The scoring was exceedingly high, the average of the regiment being exceptionally good. In the General Match 15 shots were fired, five at 200, five at 400 and five at 500 yards, without a single shot missed. The total possible score was 75, and out of 208 competitors 30 men scored 60 or better.

The attendance was exceptionally good, the competitors swarming on an estimated 400 of all ranks, and the contests were very keen, especially among the tyros, or young shots, who had a very tempting prize hung up for competition, viz., the Magazine trophy, consisting of three complete silver tea sets, valued at \$40 each, presented by the Tuckett Tobacco Co. of Hamilton. This prize was limited to company teams of three men of the rank and file, and only tyros who had never won a prize of \$5 or over were eligible. This prize was won by Company's first team, with a score of 191, on an average of 63.7 points per man. The team consisted of Corp. Young, Pte. Boyle and Pte. Ferguson.

Another match which was an innovation was the Skirmishing Match. Capt. Macdonald decided to conduct this match under service conditions, and give the men an opportunity of using magazine fire, something hitherto unknown in a rifle match here. Twelve men per company were lined up 600 yards from the targets. Twenty rounds for men of ammunition were distributed. The magazines were loaded with 10 rounds for the decisive moment, and 10 rounds were for use in volleys, or skirmishing. The teams then advanced and began firing volleys. As the targets were at 600 yards, the command was given for independent firing, and single shots were delivered at each appearance of the targets. At 200 yards from the targets, the command was given to load and fire. The targets were very good, and the teams were very well pleased with this match, and the target diagrams were very good. Company, the winners, scored 85 bullets, or an average of 28.3 points per man. A slight change was made in the conditions for the General Match, and the account of the weather and the uncertainty of men turning out. Instead of teams of 20 previously named men, the 20 highest scores in any company are eligible.

HON. ALEX. ROSS IS DEAD

Former Provincial Treasurer and More Recent Clerk of the County Court No More.

HAD BEEN AILING FOR SOME MONTHS.

An Example of a Self-Made Man Who Rose by Hard Work to Distinction.

Hon. Alexander M. Ross, Clerk of the County Court and formerly M.L.A. for West Huron, and Provincial Treasurer, died on Saturday afternoon at 2.30 o'clock in Grace Hospital. Hon. Mr. Ross had been in ill health for several months past and returned from Muskoka about four weeks ago. About two weeks ago he was removed to the hospital where he gradually sank.

Sketch of His Career. Deceased was born in Dundee, Scotland, April 2, 1829, and was the son of the late John Ross, a well-known farmer. He came to this country with his parents in 1853 and settled in Dundee. He was educated in the Public School at Dundee and in his 14th year learned the carpenter's trade. At this occupation he remained until he was 20 years of age, when he entered the old Bank of Upper Canada as a clerk, but resigned to accept the appointment of paymaster in the old Bank of Upper Canada in 1858. He remained in this position for 25 years, resigning in 1883 on his appointment as provincial treasurer.
