BARON HAYASHI ONCE DECEASED.

Japanese Minister to Great Britain
Has Strange Career.

London, March 6.—Baron Hayashi, the Japanese minister to Great Britain, from a political prisoner sentenced to be executed, has risen to one of the highest diplomatic posts in the gift of his country. He spent several years at the University of London and returned to his own country to take part in the rebellion of the revolutionaries, between 1885 and 1888.

The revolt was put down and the revolutionaries, Hayashi and the rest, were turned over to the "lord high executioner" who put them to death. Hayashi, the condemned rebel, was taken from his cage and performed the task so well that the mikado pardoned him and made him an interpreter. At that time there were only five or six Japanese who could speak English. His rise to honors since has been rapid.

CAPT. SARTORIUS TO WED.

New York, March 6.—Announcement has been made at Washington of the engagement of Mlle. Germaine Cecil Sartorius of Paris to Capt. Algernon Sartorius. The marriage, it is said, will be solemnized in Paris in June. Mlle. Sartorius is a member of a distinguished Paris and London family. Her mother, Mme. Sartorius, is the daughter of a French nobleman, and her father, M. Sartorius, is a well-known English musician. Her brother, M. Charles Sartorius, is secretary general of the French Congo. She is a goldsmith of the late Count of Paris, and is described as a beautiful blonde of 22 years.
