DEFICIT OF \$27,000
HAS BEEN WIPED OUT
BY WOMEN'S EFFORTS

Splendid Work Has Been Done
by Presbyterian W. M. S.

MISSION CONFERENCE

Excellent Reports Were Presented
From All Over
London District.

The Women's Missionary Society of the London Presbytery, including auxiliaries and mission bands of the various Presbyterian churches within the bounds of the presbytery, has raised within the past year the sum of \$27,000, an advance of more than \$2,000 over last year. Last year there was a marked advance in contributions over the previous year. Amid war conditions and with all the war relief duties devolving upon the members, the Women's Missionary Society in the past three years has made striking progress.

Last April, in response to an appeal from the general board, the total amount forwarded from the London Presbytery was \$1,153, collected at Easter thanksgiving meetings.

The foregoing report was presented by the treasurer, Mrs. M. B. McEachern, at the first session of the annual meeting of the London Presbytery, W. M. S., which opened at 2 o'clock today in the First Presbyterian Church, with a large attendance of delegates from outside points and representatives of the city Presbyterian churches.

President's Address.
In her presidential address delivered immediately after the opening exercises, Mrs. D. L. McCrae referred to a great reason for thanksgiving on the part of the Women's Missionary Society, namely, that a deficit of the general board of \$27,000 has been wiped out, thanks to special effort on the part of auxiliaries and bands, with the result that a new year has begun with a clean sheet and a most hopeful outlook for the future.

Deep regret was expressed for the serious illness of Rev. Dr. Grant, superintendent of home missions, who in the past has given invaluable assistance to the Women's Missionary Society. The president brought her address to a close with an appeal for still greater consecration and faithfulness in service. She recalled the text chosen on the occasion of the coronation of the present king, "I am among you as one who serves." The selection of such a text had not been the accident, but inspiration. No one had been called upon for greater service than the king in the past few years. The meaning and privilege of service were dwelt upon, the speaker declaring service to be the love of love, while love is the fulfilling of the law.

Afternoon Session.
The greater part of the afternoon was devoted to reports from the various district secretaries, and time permitted for discussion following each of these. Mrs. Peiper of St. Thomas had a most encouraging report on Mission Bands, in which she stated that in the past year four new bands have been organized and three reorganized, making a total of 33, with a membership of 745, an increase over the previous year. The total amount raised by the bands was \$1,083.31.

The honor of winning the banner has gone to the Campbellton Mission Band, Duff's Church, Dunwich, which, organized only fifteen months, has outstripped all others in progress made.

In the absence of the illness of Mrs. F. Ballantyne, secretary of supplies, her report was read by her husband, Rev. F. Ballantyne.

Hearty Response.
Reference was made to the hearty response met from auxiliaries and bands. Supplies of clothing, hospital supplies, canned fruit, etc., of a total value of \$5,000 pounds and valued at \$2,233.34, had been sent in sales to Vegreville Hospital and Mission House, to the Birnie Industrial School and mission fields of Mr. Steenson and Rev. Mr. Zalkinak in the west. In addition supplies have gone to missionaries and their families. A large amount of the goods forwarded this year has been now. A point emphasized in connection with the work of forwarding supplies was that the practical work appeals to old and young, and is a source of gaining access to homes of the stranger within our gates. It further promotes established bonds of sympathy between the workers and citizens of Canada of diverse nationalities.

Doors Closed.
Mrs. Wood (city) told of the strangers department, which has been inaugurated in connection with several of the auxiliaries. The members of this committee visit the sick in hospitals, the shut-ins, and make a habit of extending a welcome to strangers, as well as keeping men overseas cheered with news from home. Crawford, Wilton Grove, told of the growing interest in the work of forwarding books, magazines, etc., to mission fields, isolated camps, etc., and the boon this is proving. Letters have come back telling how the books are read and re-read.

A new system of distribution adopted in the past year has resulted in establishing the "personal touch" and establishing interesting relations between donors and recipients. Each auxiliary now packs and forwards prepaid the literature which it contributes.

Missionary Work.
Mrs. Peterman explained the methods which have been adopted to keep before the societies the literature containing the best and latest information respecting the missionary work. She urged the auxiliaries to invest a small amount each year through the missionary secretary for literature, with a view to receiving a complete file of missionary literature at the rate of 10c.

A story of a surprising amount of work done by "home helpers" was told by Mrs. Evans of St. Thomas. Four hundred and sixty-five home helpers enrolled in the presbytery have contributed \$441.50. In many cases, women who have believed themselves too busy to extend missions but were willing to do their share have been identified themselves as active members of the organization, in which they have been enrolled as home helpers.

Mrs. Alex Henderson, city, reported an increase of 28 subscribers for the official organ of the W. M. S., the "Messenger," making a total of 1,07. She impressed upon the missionary workers present that the Messenger should be in every home. Ways were suggested of interesting the various members of the family in the magazine.

Mrs. Anderson of Wilton Grove reported briefly on the work of the press committee.

MEDICAL WORKERS

ARE BADLY NEEDED,
SAYS MISSIONARY

Rev. Dr. Menzies Home From
Honan on Furlough.

DEATH-RATE IS HIGH

Urgent Appeal Made at Meeting of Presbyterian Women's Society.

Following a vivid description of conditions in China which are responsible for crying need of trained medical workers, Rev. Dr. Menzies, who is on furlough from Honan, China, last evening in the First Presbyterian Church, made an urgent appeal for recruits for the service and stronger support in the home land, at the conclusion of the annual meeting of the London Presbytery Women's Missionary Society.

One hospital, erected at a cost of \$1,350, in Dr. Menzies' charge, ministers to a population of 2,000,000 people. Come long Distances. Patients come by the thousands, sometimes on long pilgrimages, sometimes carried in baskets, to find relief from their sufferings. There are no nurses to prepare the patients, to make ready the rooms. The doctor must do all with such help as assistants chosen from the local population can give. Sometimes as many as 100 cases are treated in the dispensary in one afternoon. Eleven operations have been performed by the doctor in one afternoon.

"They are much the same class as came to our Lord for healing," said the speaker. "There are only one in a hundred in Canada who would probably have 10 or 20 beds in a building the size of our hospital. We pack in a hundred. We are doing all in our power to show these people the heart of Jesus through relieving their sufferings. I do not believe that Jesus intended the ministry of healing to be forgotten. While we have been in China a quarter of a century, not one single woman has offered herself as a missionary nurse. There is only one in all Honan. Yet I doubt if even the doctors' field would be as big as the field of the nurse. A nurse would be called ten times, and perhaps 50 to 100, and the influence of a nurse in the home would be incalculable."

High Death Rate.
"Think of the need. The death-rate is as high as the birth-rate. No knowledge of first principles of hygiene, sanitation, of the first principles of cleanliness, of care of the sick, which will train for something more than the service of giving a band in which we kept in view the volunteering of one of the members for service."

"They are much the same class as came to our Lord for healing," said the speaker. "There are only one in a hundred in Canada who would probably have 10 or 20 beds in a building the size of our hospital. We pack in a hundred. We are doing all in our power to show these people the heart of Jesus through relieving their sufferings. I do not believe that Jesus intended the ministry of healing to be forgotten. Yet I doubt if even the doctors' field would be as big as the field of the nurse. Religious Training.
Rev. W. J. Knox, minister of the church, presided, and gave a striking address on the place of missionary instruction in religious training. He declared missionary training to be a definite place in the training of all the children and not be confined to a few. "To be adequately educated," said Mr. Knox, "the boy and girl must develop missionary interest. The training to be along concrete lines, something that can be seen and understood and which will promote reaction on the part of the children in giving and service."

Presented Banner.
An interesting feature was the presentation of a beautiful banner to the Campbellton Mission Band of Duff's Church, Dunwich, the band which stands first in the Presbytery this year in points of promptness, methods of work, and increased percentage. An enjoyable solo was rendered by Miss Francis Cullis, and a short recital given by Cecilia C. Leitchridge, organist, from 7:30 to 8 o'clock. Mrs. Hugh McFarlane presided at the organ in the afternoon.
