Trench Fever the Reducer of Armies, Yet Seldom Fatal

American Red Cross through medical officers of the American expeditionary force at a British base hospital, it has been found that this malady assaults the fighting man in two ways.

A.—Use a good antiseptic tooth paste, and 1 dram compound tincture of bendary as a mouth wash. Drink three quarts of distilled water or a pure carbonate water daily; also cream, olive oil, whey and buttermilk. Eat green vegetables, shun starchy foods, those which are highly seasoned, rich, greasy rations, coffee and tea. Obtain daily outdoor exercise; 5 grains of either one of the following may be tried after each meal: Bile salts, or ox-gall, or ox-bile. The bowels must be kept active.
