





CLOTHING WORKERS WILL NOT STRIKE

Recognition of Toronto Organization is Now Practically General. NO MONTREAL WORK. Local Employees Will Not Touch Work Emanating From Strike City.

turned from Montreal where he has been investigating the clothing workers' strike there, explained it from the union point of view. He said that the strike is due to a large number of the manufacturers having formed an association with the object of preventing their workers from belonging to any organization. "The workers have made no demands for anything," he said, "simply the right to organize. I went to Montreal for the purpose of attempting to settle it, but I found the manufacturers stubborn, but I shall make further efforts." He said that a sympathy strike in Toronto will not help the Montreal workers. "But we shall simply refuse to be employed on Montreal strike work," he stated.

J. Bingerman, president of Toronto local union, who occupied the chair, said that as soon as they find out any Montreal work is being done in this city they will be obliged to call a strike in sympathy. "We have to organize, and in the course of about two weeks will have over 1000." He said if a strike is called in Toronto this city so far we have had no opposition except from one firm and we hope that this one will realize the fact that the members have a right to be members of a union."

SIX TORONTO MEN ARE CASUALTIES

List of Names Reported From France is Below the Average. TWO ARE DEAD. One Dies of Wounds, the Other is Killed in Action.

In the week-end casualty list six Toronto names are reported. Two are men who have made the supreme sacrifice, one being killed in action. Another soldier is reported wounded and missing. Three men are listed as wounded.

BAKERY THREATENED BY TWO SMALL FIRES

Bathurst St. Building Damaged on Saturday and Again on Sunday Morning. Fire, believed to be due to defective wiring, damaged Weston's bakery, 429 Bathurst street, Saturday night to the extent of \$1500. The blaze started on the ground floor near the elevator shaft at 11.28, and when the firemen arrived on the scene had gained a good hold. The damage to the building is \$1500, to the contents \$3000. The loss is covered by insurance.

MUCH DAMAGE DONE BY WATER SYSTEM

Fire Started Sprinkling and Much of Building's Contents Was Spoiled. Fire, which started in a rubbish pile on the third floor of the A. E. Ross building, 93-97 Spadina avenue, at 7 o'clock Saturday night, melted a plug on the sprinkler system, causing the water to deluge the first, second and third floors and damage the contents to the extent of \$35,000. The loss is covered by insurance.
