### AMERICAN BANKS REFUSE MORE CREDIT TO BRAZIL

Rio Janeiro, Sept. 3.—Financial con-ditions in Brazil have become so seri ous and exchange rates so erratic that North American banks and merchants are refusing further credits to Brazil-ian concerns until the situation shall have improved, according to speakers at a meeting of the semi-official Comat a meeting of the semi-official com-mercial Association. It was asserted that several New York concerns al-leady had ordered the discontinuance of shipments to Brazil.

#### **BOLSHEVIK TROOPS** MARCHING ON GEORGIA

Paris, Sept. 3.-Ten thousand Bol-shevik troops are marching from Persia on Georgia, according to a Tiflis despatch to the East Express-Telegraph Agency under date of Sep-tember 1. The Persian Bolsheviki are also menacing Armenia. Russian soviet commissaries com mand the troops, the despatch says, who are former officers of the Bol-shevik army. Berlin, Sept. 3 .- Dr. Kopp, the Berlin representative of the Russian sov-iet government, is reported to have presented a note to the German government protesting against the par-ticipation of the inter-allied commission in disarming and interning Rus-sian troops who have crossed the frontier into Germany. He demands that Germany see to it that such "in-terference" shall not recur.
