Congress Conferees Agree on Various Items in the Fordney Bill.

GOES BACK TO HOUSE

Washington, Feb. 24.—Differences in the Fordney emergency tariff bill, as it passed the house and senate, were smoothed out today by conference commissions of the two branches of congress...

While agreeing to the tariff on the sugar, the house conferees stood pat on a refusal to permit a tariff on hides and leather products.

Some differences in the provision, originally in the bill for a duty on rice, compelled a re-writing of that item with a new rate of one cent per pound on all except cleaned rice and rice used for the manufacture of canned foods.
