July.—We have a word to say to farmers about training horses. It is easy to train a horse not to be dangerous, but it r quires patience and good sense in the trainer and something like good sense in the colt, for there is a very great difference in all animals. Be gentle and kind. Early accustom colts to a saddle and girth or harness. Teach them to hold back a carriage on a down hill grade by bracing their hips against it. A horse taught in that way would not be scared if the breast strap should give way or the pole break. Educate your colts; train them correctly. The usual methods of breaking young horses are cruel and far from successful. Early use to the bit, and early saddling and harnessing with gentle treatment will do wonders.
