\$133,874,528

What Canadian Speculators and Investors Took Care of Last Year.

(Montreal Star). It is estimated that Canadian speculators and investors were asked to take care of \$133,874,528 in new issues during 1905.

Of this amount \$25,822,649 was in connection with the re-organization of existing corporations, but resulted in placing additional bonds in the market. Compared with 1904 the issues were:

The total issue of \$19,001,191 municipal bonds was made by 111 municipalities, 26 in the west (including Winnipeg and west of it), leaving \$4,628,576, and 115 eastern municipalities, \$4,470,615. Of this total Canada has taken 90 per cent., the United States, probably 15 per cent., and Britain 5 per cent.

Of the total of nearly 100 million new issues by corporations, the chief issues were by the Grand Trunk Pacific and Canadian Northern. These totaled nearly \$1 billion, while the C. P. R. issued nearly four million, and Dominion of companies incorporated by Canadians to operate in Rio de Janeiro, Mexico and Cuba make up about \$50,000,000.

The total issues under re-organization was: Canada Atlantic \$1,000,000; Dominion Coal \$1,000,000; Winnipeg Electric \$1,000,000; Shawinigan Power \$1,000,000.

Issues already known to be coming upon the market in 1906: Provincial - Prince Edward Island \$500,000; Ontario \$500,000; British Columbia \$500,000; New Brunswick \$1,000,000.

HEAVY SALES OF PIG IRON

The Iron Trade Review of Cleveland, Ohio, notes that an encouraging feature of present conditions in the iron and steel industry is found in the heavy tonnage both of pig iron and finished materials which are selling for immediate consumption.

Largely by reason of the open winter scrap of late has not kept pace with the increasing strength in other lines. As a consequence bar iron has weakened, and prices have become more irregular, ranging from 1.80 to 2.00. Coal is easier than for some time past, and during the week found at \$2.60 for furnace and \$3.50 for foundry grades.
