GERMAN CONSUL SENT FROM
SEATTLE TO ATLANTA, GA.

Seattle, Wash., May 28.—Dr. Wilhelm Mueller, German Consul here for the last three months, has been transferred to Atlanta, Ga. He will be succeeded at Seattle by Dr. E. Zopf, present German Consul at Atlanta.

Dr. Mueller was technically arrested

on a state warrant, charging conspiracy to bribe an employee of a shipbuilding company to disclose the company's business secrets in an effort to learn whether the company was building submarines for Canada.

The consul protested that he was innocent from arrest under the treaty between the United States and Germany and made complaint to the State Department through the German ambassador at Washington. Subsequently the conspiracy charge was dismissed.

NOTED LEADER OF SOCIETY DEAD

Mrs. Stuyvesant Fish Passes Away
at the Age of Sixty

New York, May 28.—Mrs. Stuyvesant Fish, a noted society leader, is dead at her home at Glencliff, Garrison, N. Y. Death is said to have resulted from a stroke of some kind.

The death of Mrs. Fish brings mourning to hundreds of friends who knew and admired her as one of the most hospitable and kindly social leaders in America. Her illness was sudden, so unlooked for, that she was stricken while planning to give a large garden party and luncheon within a few days at Glencliff, her splendid estate at Garrison-on-the-Hudson.

Miss Fish was suddenly seized with a stroke of what seemed to be paralysis, soon after luncheon. Dr. Richard Giles was called from Cold Spring. She did not rally and died at ten o'clock at night. Her husband was with her. The children arrived soon after her death.

Mrs. Fish was Miss Martin G. Anthony and was born in New York about sixty years ago. As the wife of a prominent banker, Mrs. Fish became a member of one of New York's oldest and most exclusive and aristocratic families. For years she had been the social leader of her set, and always delighted in doing things just a little different than her associates and equals.

She spent money lavishly to entertain her friends and to maintain her leadership in New York and Newport social circles. For many years the Fish summer home in Newport was the centre of society. She thought nothing of engaging an entire theatrical company and chartering a special train from New York or Boston to transport them to Newport and send them back after their performance at her home for her guests. She was opposed to suffrage for women, declaring it to be ridiculous, and on more than one occasion denounced modern high society as frivolous and narrow. Although a recognized member of the Four Hundred by the public, she never took much stock in the effort to limit society in this country to such a small circle.

Mrs. Fish was a patron of art, literature and painting. She was ever ready to encourage talent in every avenue of American activity, and went so far as to declare that American dressmakers excelled those of Paris, declaring that if American women would encourage them, Parisians would soon be wearing American gowns instead of Americans running to Paris for their costumes.

For the militant English suffragette she had a horror, and declared in an interview not long ago that the increasing demand of women for equality in politics and business and the professions was creating a sex antagonism among men, eliminating sentiment and romance in every day life.

She also had strong opinions about divorce, saying one time that she preferred the old maid to the divorcee. The latter declaration hit right home among her set and caused a considerable social rebellion.

She was a great traveler, and her husband provided a train of the finest cars that the Pullman people ever turned out for the use of his wife and friends who accompanied her on her trips about the country. She was well known at Hot Springs, where she and her husband were easily the social leader during her stay in those places. Her dinners and balls and parties were always the grandest affairs of the kind in her localities.

Her gowns were always elaborate and becoming. As a conversationalist she had few superiors in her set. She was one of the best hostesses in the country and always kept up her interest in outdoor life. The marriage of her only daughter some years ago was one of the most brilliant social events.

UNITED STATES
WILL ATTEMPT TO
"PUNISH" MEXICO

President Decides to Serve Notice on
Warring Nations That Means Will
Be Taken to Enforce Peace.

Washington, May 28.—President Wilson has decided to serve notice on all the warring nations in Mexico that conditions in that country have become intolerable, and that unless they, themselves, complete the situation soon, some other means may have to be employed to accomplish the result.

The first intimation of the president's determination to take this step came today in his appeal issued as head of the American Red Cross Society, setting forth that "due to several years of internal disturbances, the unfortunate people of many parts of Mexico have been reduced to the verge of starvation," and urging contributions to relief funds.

Later the White House gave out the following: "When the president's appeal for aid for the Mexicans was issued it was also stated at the executive offices that a statement from the president on the present situation in Mexico might be expected within the next few days."

This statement has been prepared and will be issued after the cabinet meeting next Tuesday, and then communicated to the leaders of all the Mexican factions.

ALIENS PLEAD
GUILTY TO FRAUD
IN U. S. COURT

New York, May 28.—Plea of guilty were entered in the Federal Court late today by Franz Rosenberg, of Hanover, Germany; Sigmund Kerman and Albert B. Newman, of Hungary, to indictments charging them with having defrauded the United States by filing false manifests at the Custom House in connection with an alleged effort to get contraband of war to belligerents by concealing rubber within bales of cotton waste and barrels of rosin shipped on the steamers Camilla and Credia. The first two were fined \$500 each, and Newman \$300.

The three men admitted that their purpose was to circumvent the Allies, and by so doing they believed they were performing a patriotic duty.

Before sentence was passed, Roger B. Wood, assistant United States district attorney, asked for severe punishment for the men "who engage in a scheme so clearly in violation of the laws of every honest merchant in the United States," and which, he added, "might easily result in the loss of all the shipments from this country."

Harry Salomon and Albert Salomon, jointly indicted with the three others, pleaded not guilty and their case was postponed.
