Clerical League. The team from Waterbury & Bling captured three points from Starr's roll in the Clerical League game.

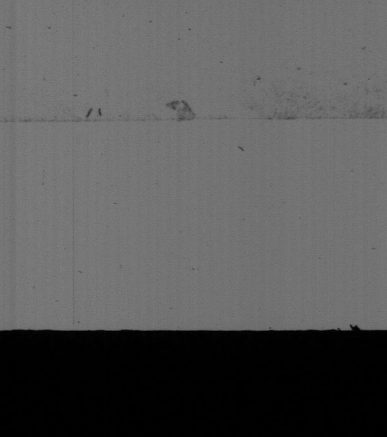
Garrison Spots Club. The bowling league of the Garrison Sports Club got away to a great start last night on the armory alleys.
