## PRICE OF BREAD ONE CENT LOWER

The price of bread in St. John was reduced one cent a loaf yesterday when bread retailed at twelve cents the wrapped loaf, weighing twenty-four ounces. The wholesale price is now eleven cents for the wrapped loaf. The last drop of one cent a loaf was made on September 19. In the last twelve months there has been a reduction of four cents on the price of a loaf of bread in St. John. At its peak, last fall, bread was retailed in the city for sixteen cents a loaf. The decline in flour has been steady for the last month and a half. The price of flour has dropped \$3.25 a barrel since September 1 and is now \$3.50, wholesale.

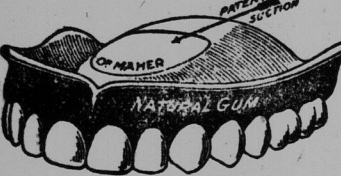
