is expected by the university athletic council in a day or two.  
Correspondence has been begun with McGill and Toronto Universities for games in Montreal and Toronto, and it is expected that two or three other matches may be arranged if the trip is taken during the Christmas holidays. Aside from the Canadian trip, Yale is planning to meet Harvard and Princeton in the usual series, and a few other games will be scheduled.  
The hockey squad will be called out by Captain Dave Ingalls late in the week. He was the only American naval ace during the war, and was prevented from playing football this fall by an injured knee, but will again attempt hockey.  
A Million Dollar Arena.  
Montreal, Dec. 2.—Montreal is to have a million dollar arena, right in the centre of the west end residence district, not very far from Windsor street, and near Dorchester street. This arena, built to seat six thousand people, and with standing room for six thousand more, is to be ready for hockey by January 1.  
The steel work has been ordered and the final details only are to be settled. The authority for the news is R. Montgomery Rodden, the well known local architect, who planned and built the old Montreal Arena, which was burned down in Westmount, and who will supervise the erection of this one.  
The new institution, which will include a garage, will be owned by a popular stock company, with a capital of two million dollars, and stock will be sold at \$10 a share so that all those interested in hockey and other indoor sports can acquire some.

Cleveland, Dec. 3.—Dave Driscoll of Jersey City, N. J., has signed Johnny Kilbane, featherweight champion of the world, to box Joey Fox, Benny Valgar, and Johnny Dundee.  
The first match will be held Dec. 22, the second three weeks later and the third three weeks after the second. Such is scheduled to go eight rounds.  
Fox and Valgar are to make 122 pounds at three o'clock or 128 pounds at 6 p. m. on the day of their match. No weight was stipulated for Dundee.
