GIRL SLAIN BY ENVOY

German Statesman Kills Sweetheart and Commits Suicide. Berlin, Oct. 8.—Baron von Roden, the newly appointed German minister to Abyssinia, committed suicide after killing his sweetheart, a dressmaker named Pirechke. Von Roden had been German Consul at Lemberg, and was talented and ambitious. He expected rapid advancement, but despite the attractions of diplomatic success, it is known that the girl had wished to marry the Baron for thirteen years, but her parents refused their sanction to what they regarded as a mesalliance. Before killing himself the Baron wrote to his parents, asking their forgiveness, and saying that life had no further interest for him.

VICTORIAN NURSES

The monthly meeting of the executive council of the board of governors of the Victorian Order of Nurses for Canada was held in Ottawa last week, at the home of the order, 278 Somerset street, J. M. Courtney presiding. The chief superintendent's report for September begins with her inspection visit to Minnedoua, Mich. The hospital there, like others mentioned in previous reports, has been greatly improved by the addition of a veranda and the interior has been re-arranged. Last year the order was an extra grant of \$1,000 which has been productive of much good to the hospital. The Ladies Aid at Minnedoua has been very energetic, and has raised enough money to pay for installing running water in the hospital there, which adds much to the convenience of those in the institution.

Good work is being done at Yorkton, and the hospital now has as many patients as can be accommodated. The record from Edmonton is very satisfactory, and the committee are planning to have a nurses' home, as at present the nurses are too scattered over the district. A meeting was held in Edson, where the people are very anxious to have a hospital in affiliation with the order. They have a good site for the building, and will likely ask for a grant.

The experiment of having a country nurse in Innisfail, has, thus far, proved a great success, and the committee are most desirous of having a nursing home, so they can have a second nurse, thus enabling them to take care of the country work. There is no trouble as to finances there, the only question is that of the advisability of visiting or building a home. The hospital is now very popular, and has become well known, and it is not unlikely that a larger building will be erected in the near future.

North Vancouver now has a nurse in charge, and in a few days a nurse will be sent to open the district at Saskatoon. The following nurses were admitted to the order: Miss Anthony and the Misses Robb, Misses Muir and Pepper were re-admitted and Miss McLeod's name was put on the reserve list.
