Less active stocks were Southern Canada Power, up ½ to 79; Price Bros., unchanged at 39; Montreal Power, unchanged at 18½; Twin City, up ¼ to 68, and Dominion Textile, unchanged at 75½. Small lots of Quebec Power, Shawinigan and Atlantic Sugar appeared at 98¼, 143½ and 24½ respectively, the only change being in the first mentioned, which was up the fraction. 
