#### New Hydroplane Record

Establishing a new world's hydroplane record of 80.567 miles an hour, Miss America II, driven by Gus Wood of St. Louis, won the Lake George trophy, emblematic of the one mile speed boat championship of North America. The old record was 76.655 miles an hour, set by Miss America I here last year. The new record was the average of one-mile dashes, three downstream and three upstream. In one of the dashes downstream, as America II attained a speed of 46.6 miles an hour, covering the mile in 44.13 seconds. #### Police Stop Jack Johnson

(New York Times.) Jack Johnson, former heavyweight champion, was forbidden by the Newark police to speak at the Roosevelt Temple, First Regiment Armory, Newark, last night. The police also refused to allow him to head a parade of negroes to the temple. William J. Brennan, Director of Public Safety, took the action because of a speech Johnson made in the armory two weeks ago, when he predicted the time would soon come when negroes as a race would be able to cope with the whites.

Activity against the Ku-Klux-Klan in Newark began right after Johnson's speech, and Director Brennan is said to have determined to prevent a recurrence of the controversy.

About 2,000 negroes gathered at the armory to attend a dance and hear Johnson, but the negro pugilist made no effort to make a speech, and neither did the Rev. Sylvester L. Carruthers, pastor of the Congregationalist church, which promoted the affair.

#### Deschamps Wins

Montreal, Sept. 7.—Oscar Deschamps, local, scored a decisive victory over Eddie Wallace, of Brooklyn, lightweight, in a ten-round bout here tonight. In the other fight Frankie Engle, of Detroit, won easily from Kid Sherman, local, lightweight.

Jersey City, N. J., Sept. 8.—Johnny Wilson, champion, was summoned to appear before the New Jersey boxing commission today to explain why he did not put up a stiffer battle in his Labor Day match with Bryan Downey. The commission ordered Tex Rickard, promoter, to hold up Wilson's \$35,000 share of the purse pending the hearing. Wilson has let it be known that he intends to bring about court action to obtain the money if the commission decides to hold it up permanently.

### JOHNSON PASSES CY YOUNG'S TOTAL OF 2,290 STRIKEOUTS

A major league record which had endured for years was broken yesterday, and Walter Johnson now takes a place in baseball's Hall of Fame where Cy Young had held forth. In a stretch of twenty-two seasons of pitching in the majors, Cy registered a total of 2,290 strikeouts. Johnson, now in his seventeenth consecutive year with the Washington club, has been steadily approaching this mark, and he needed only three to equal Young's record when he went into the box yesterday morning at Philadelphia against the Mackmen.
