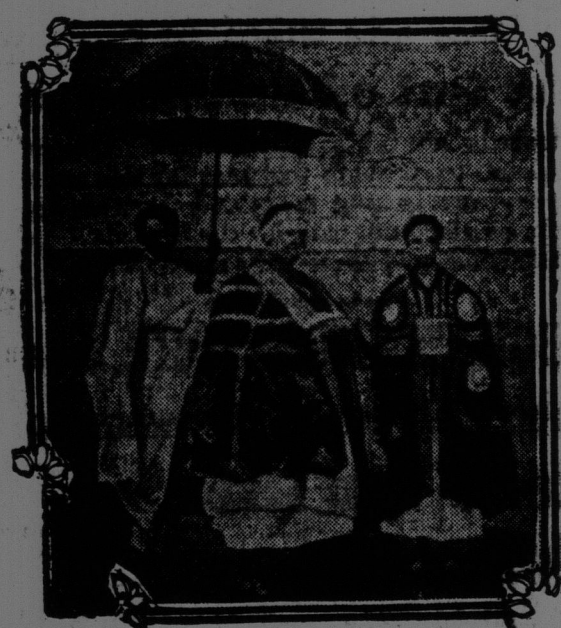

**EMPRESS OF ABYSSINIA WHO REFUSES

LONDON, April 27.—A snapshot of Empress Taytu of Abyssinia, who, after a pilgrimage to a holy shrine, has refused to return to the great Negus, and who declares that she will spend the remainder of her life in a convent.

THE AMEER STRONGLY URGES ALL TO ACQUIRE KNOWLEDGE

CAICUTTA, April 26.—In making his budget statement in the legislative council Mr. F. N. Baker, who anticipates a surplus of \$3,000,000 for the coming year despite the reduced uniform tax of one rupee per annum, said that the optimum revenue was doubtful, but that it had been decided to reduce the tax in the primary schools the secretary of state is prepared to consider a suitable scheme and to authorize it if the financial position permits.

Army charges are reduced, and though causes for anxiety are not wanting and the need for economy is increasing, the prospects for the present year, the secretary says, are full of hope.

A remarkable discovery of ammunition smuggling has been made here after a fight in which two Pathans were shot.

Two constables returning from patrol duty found three Pathans with several camels preparing to cross the bridge of boats connecting the Nowshera cantonment with the north bank of the Kabul river. When questioned they said they were going to Swat, and had nothing except empty bags and fodder for their camels.

The police asked to see the bags and were then offered bribes which they refused. They insisted on the search and when they were joined by a third constable a free fight ensued.

Two Pathans were shot and the third surrendered.

Examinations of their packs showed they had ninety packages Martini-Henry ammunition among the bags.

Lord Kitchener in a statement just issued concerning his policy said that it was purely defensive. Among other things he said:

"It is most unlikely that we will ever attack any other power or undertake operations unless forced thereto by aggression or compelled to defend what we hold. Our duty is to obtain the best possible value for our money."

"The distribution of troops has been little changed since the mutiny. We are now attempting to form divisions, self-contained in all respects which when ready to take the field would leave behind sufficient troops to provide for order and tranquility in the areas from which they are drawn."
