CLASSICS.

THESE consist of Historians, Orators, Poets, and Philosophers. Portions of the standard Greek and Latin authors, under each of these denominations, are studied.

In the First Year.

Homer's Iliad or Odyssey.
Xenophon's Cyropædia or Anabasis.
Demosthenes' Select Orations.
Horace's Satires and Epistles.
Livy, first or third decade.
Cicero de Officiis and Orations.

In Second Year.

Herodotus, Thucydides, Euripides.
Virgil's Georgics, Terence occasionally.
Tacitus: Germania, Agricola.
Juvenal and Persius.

In Third Year.

Sophocles, Æschylus, Longinus.
Aristophanes occasionally.
Tacitus and Juvenal, continued.
Lucretius occasionally.
