# Some Exhibitions on Features

## STONEWARE AND EARTHENWARE EXHIBIT

James W. Foley & Co. are showing a complete line of their manufactures in the main building and are attracting much interest.

Their stoneware consisting of jugs, butter crocks, churns, bean pots, etc., are of a quality which equals the products of the best factories in the world and surpasses anything of the same class made in Canada or imported.

Flower pots are among their products and these with other Rockingham ware are used almost exclusively in the Maritime Provinces.

The flower pots made by these people are in great demand. A well known Nova Scotia florist remarking a few days ago that they are the most suitable pots that he has been able to procure.

They are showing at their booth the Perfection Preserve Jar, of very great interest to the lady visitors to the fair.

The enterprise of Messrs. Foley & Co. has been shown lately in the manufacture of high class stove linings. The trade in these linings increased rapidly since introduced and the quality of the product recommends it strongly.

One of their specialties is a sanitary refrigerating jar for milk, cream, etc. Samples of these are on show at their booth. The users of these crocks speak very highly of them.

Special ware of any kind in clay is made at their pottery.

The output of this enterprising concern is steadily increasing. This season about two carloads of their ware was shipped to Vancouver.

## ATTRACTIVE EXHIBIT OF FINE ART GLASS

An exhibit that for attractive display and artistic design is being particularly noticed by visitors, is that of the Maritime Art Glass Works, at the end of the west wing of the main building. It was the centre of an admiring crowd yesterday, and it's hardly exaggerating to say that we will visit to the fair.

What makes the exhibit of all the more importance to local persons is the fact that everything there, with the exception of the plain glass, is made in St. John by St. John workmen in the glass works, a large modern factory on City Road. A feature that at once commands attention is the dome over the entrance in American opalescent glass. The lower parts of the walls are panelled in mirrors, and the upper sections show some handsome samples of copper-mounted bevelled and nutro cut plates for vestibules. The walls are artistically set with some exquisite samples of stained glass work. This includes decorative panels for stair windows. Some costly specimens in the style of the "Art Nouveau" are also shown. The whole design, the work of Mr. Bauer, has been artistically planned so as to blend many pretty details into one harmonious whole, and it is well deserving of the large attention which it is receiving.

## LEATHER GOODS

One of the most attractive exhibits is that of Christie Bros., Ltd., of Amherst, N. S., manufacturers of trunks, bags and suit cases. These goods have a world-wide reputation which in itself is a most valuable asset in the way of bringing trade. It is a common saying that "Christie's Baggage goes everywhere." They have quite a large export trade with the British West Indies, Newfoundland and the west. On exhibition there are among other articles a travellers sample case for confectionery, with aluminum trays, this being a special order for a western firm. A full line of ladies and gents suit cases with ebony fittings, etc., cut glass bottles and wardrobe trunks which arrive with the clothing ready for wear, are shown. The Vulcanized fibre binding used by this firm is most substantial. Messrs Macaulay Bros. have purchased the entire exhibit.

The leading lines are on view at the exhibit in the machinery hall, and are well worth a visit. On the principle that seeing is believing the body of one of the "Victory" steel ranges are shown, giving a full view of its construction. It contains all the structural improvements which have made the Fawcett ranges famous, and distinguishes them from the ordinary ranges of other makers. The hot blast, smoke consuming fire box, for example, is guaranteed to reduce the quantity of fuel burned. Other popular features include an unusually spacious oven fitted with a traversed bottom, a grilling plate for broiling, a combination grate for coal or wood, and extra thick asbestos insulation. The range is of beautiful proportions with plain nicked trimmings, and presents a very handsome appearance.

The unsolicited testimonials which the Fawcett Company are constantly receiving from all parts of Canada are the best proof of their contention that their ranges are no equal on the market. The Fawcett Company invite comparison with other stoves and ranges in the exhibition.

A special feature of the new "Pierless" range is the new patent construction attached to the hot water closet. By excluding the passage of air between the body of the range and the detachable closet, water can be heated to boiling point in half the time required with ordinary cookers. The reservoir has a capacity of ten gallons, and is guaranteed to boil water.

Cast iron ranges are still very popular and to meet the public taste the Fawcett Company make a speciality of the Prince Crawford and Sovereign ranges which burn hard coal, soft coal, or wood, and contain the latest improvements in the construction of the ovens, flues, dampers and grates.

In heating stoves, the celebrated "Sackville Silver Moon" self feeder, at once attracts the visitor. This is another coal saver, two of its special features being a hot blast, not an anti-clinker grate, which allows free expansion and last indefinitely. A fine exhibit is also shown in hot blast heating stoves and oaks.

Sometimes naturally attaches to the personality of a concern which has established and maintained such an enviable record as the Fawcett Company. The business was started in Sackville in 1860 by the late Charles Fawcett, and was continued under his name until six years ago when the Fawcett Manufacturing Company, Limited, was organized. The knitting machine is driven by a Canadian Fairbanks motor and the power is supplied by the St. John Street Railway.

Their products can be had from the Atlantic to the Pacific and the name "Hewson's" stands for quality and always ensures good value to the purchaser.

Their worsted suitings for both ladies and gentlemen are nicely arranged and one has only to look them over and then they are satisfied that right here in Canada the Hewson woollen mills are making materials equal to if not better than imported.

They are also showing a nice assortment of steamer rugs and blankets, together with a very wide range of ladies and gentlemen's sweater coats.

Their underwear lines are also complete and they manufacture weights suitable for any season of the year.

The demand for all their products has been increasing from year to year, and in order to meet the demand they have had to install new machinery.

## THE WINDSOR FOUNDRY AND MACHINE CO.

Among the exhibits near the main entrance is that of the Windsor Foundry and Machine Co., which shows a splendid assortment of stoves of all kinds. Here can be found the New Silver Moon self-feeder in all of its sizes, made from the original pattern. Mr. R. P. Whipple, who is in charge will explain to the visitor that the original pattern of the New Silver Moon possesses many advantages over the stoves made from other patterns which have departed from the original. The lid of the stove is lifted when the top is moved and beneath and around the chamber that catches the gas from the burning coal has been retained in the product of the Windsor Foundry and Machine Co. It is not possible for the gas to escape but it must depart by the means intended for it by the pipe and chimney.

There are some handsome ranges and hall stoves of different patterns suitable for both coal and wood, shown in this space, and had the exhibition management been more generous in their allotment of room, the Windsor Foundry and Machine Co. would have shown many other specimens of the goods made by them. Their hot air furnaces have not only a provincial reputation, but are well and favorably known wherever they have been used. This enterprising concern is well known as a successful exhibitor and can claim to be the only stove manufacturers in Canada who have been awarded a gold medal for the Silver Moon stoves. Their business at Windsor, N. S. is a very large concern indeed and their manufactures include everything that is required by ships as well as mills, and quite recently they have made a speciality of barrel making machinery. 
