The former German emperor asserts that he proposed a league of nations consisting of the Triple Alliance and the French and Russian Alliance, and that this proposal was accepted by the Russian emperor and Count Witte.

After detailing in an earlier chapter a proposal of the German emperor for an offensive economic alliance getween Russia and Germany against the United States, Count Witte refers to his so-called league of nations proposal.

In 1905 County Witte saw the German ruler on his way to Russia after negotiating the treaty of Portsmouth, and their talk assumed a serious aspect.
