

The following letter has been received from a prominent Government official, under date of Toronto, March 1st, 1915:—

"Sir:—I am instructed to advise you that notification has been received from high authority that agents have been instructed to call on engineers and plumbers at different institutions and factories throughout the Dominion of Canada asking the institution or firm to try a lubricant, of which they will leave a sample in a box.
