Mr. Pratte studies above all to reach the bighest grade in quality. He has introduced into his planos a new patent action far more desirable than any other produced in America up to this date. The cases are made in rare and beautiful woods, specimens being exhibited in myx woods, satinwood, Brazilian rosewood, prima vera, Brazilian mahogany, Caucasian walnut and Persian walnut. There is also an excellent Æolian selfplaying organ, in which by means of a Bre mechanical apparatus anyone can play the most difficult compositions with expression. Amongst the instruments is an old-fashioned piano made in Lon-don, England, by Clementi, in 1798, and surmounted by an exhibit showing the progress made in the manufacture ef a portion of the action of pianos from the year 1797 down to the present date. This latter item is most interesting to the curious visitor.
