MONK, GEORGE WILLIAM. (*Carleton.*)

Youngest s. of the late Capt. John Benning Monk, H. M. 97th Regt. of Foot; grandson of the late Hon. G. H. Monk, who originally a midshipman under Admiral Boscawen, entered the army and became Major of the Royal Fusileers, but retired and was admitted to the Bar, and finally attained a seat on the Bench., N.S., and grandnephew of Sir James Monk, Atty.-Gen. of N.S., who claimed descent from George Monk, Duke of Albermarle. B. 10 Sept., 1838. Ed. at By town (now Ottawa) and Potsdam, N.Y. M., first, Jan. 1863, Emily Blanch, dau. of the late Col. Dyer, formerly of the 37th Regt. of Foot. (She d.) Second 1887, Miss Mulock, sister of William Mulock, M.P. Was a Deputy G.M. of the Grand Black Chapter of Orangemen B.A. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g.e. 1871, but unseated on petition; re-elected Jan. 1872; returned by acclamation at g.e. 1875; re-elected at g.e. 1879, 1883, 1886 and 1890. A Liberal Conservative, and opposed to the present Government.—*South March, Ont; Rideau Club; Albany Club, Toronto.*

MOORE, JOHN DOUGLAS. (*South Waterloo.*)

Father, George Moore, was a native of Northumberland, Eng., and came to Can. in 1834. Mother, was a native of Roxboroughshire, Scot. B. in Tp. of North Dumfries, Ont., 1843, and ed. at the Public School. M. 1878, Elizabeth Lucy, dau. of Thomas Moffat. Is a farmer. Has been Councillor, Deputy Reeve and Reeve of North Dumfries and Warden of the Co. of Waterloo, Presdt. of South Waterloo Farmer's Institute; Presdt. of Farmer's Mutual Insurance Company. First returned to Leg. Assem. at last g.e. A Liberal. —*Galt, Ont.*

MOWAT, Hon. OLIVER Q.C., LL.D. (*North Oxford.*)

Eldest s. of the late John Mowat, Esq., formerly of Canisby, Caithness-shire, Scot., who, after serving in the British Army during the campaign in Portugal and Spain under Lord Wellington, came to Can. 1816, and settled at Kingston, by Miss Levack; and brother of the Rev.
