DRAFT OF INSTRUCTIONS passed under the Royal Sign-Manual and Signet to the Governor-General of the Dominion of Canada.

Instructions to our governor-general in and over our dominion of Cana- Dated 5th da, or, in his absence, to our lieutenant-governor or the officer for the October, 1878. time being administering the government of our said Dominion.

Given at our court at Balmoral, this fifth day of October, 1878, in the forty-second year of our reign.
