An Act for permitting the Exportation to Newfoundland of Foreign Salt, Duty free, from the Import Warehouses at the Port of Brissol; and for repealing so much of an Act of the last Session as allows Salt, the Produce of any Part of Europe South of Cape Finisterre, to be shipped in any Port of Europe direct to certain Ports in North America.

THEREAS by an Act made in the Thirty-ninth Year of the 39G. 3. c. 65. Reign of His present Majesty, among other Things, for amending an Act made in the Thirty-eighth Year of the Reign of 38 G.3.c. 89. His present Majesty, for transferring the Management of the Salt Duties to the Commissioners of Excise, reciting among other Things that it was expedient to allow any fuch Foreign Salt as is in the faid Act in that Behalf mentioned, to be taken from and out of any fuch Warehouse, Storehouse, or Cellar, as is in the faid Act mentioned, for the Purpose in the faid Act of the Thirty-ninth Year aforesaid mentioned, it is enacted, that it shall and may be lawful to or for any Person or Persons within Twelve Months after the Importation and landing thereof, to take, free of Duty, for the Purpose of exporting the same in any Ship or Vessel not of less Burthen than Forty Tons, to Newfoundland, for curing Cod Fish, Ling, or Hake, to be there caught, any Quantity exceeding Fifty Bushels at a Time of Foreign Salt, from and out of any Import Warehouse, Storehouse, or Cellar, at either of the Ports of Poole, Dartmouth, Falmouth, or Glafgow, in which the same had been put in Manner in the said last-mentioned Act mentioned, on giving fuch Bond or Security as is in the faid last mentioned A& mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to allow the Exportation of any fuch Foreign Salt from the Port of Bristol in Manner and for the Purpose afore-
