EVIDENCE OF MR. G.S. MEGAFFIN

Mr. Megaffin at the outset of his evidence assures all concerned that he has no axe to grind, no feeling or prejudice in any way against the persons about whom he speaks, and in his fifty-three pages of evidence proceeds to show in every way that he is bitterly biased, personal and vindicative in what he says, and that he has no regard for the truth.
