My dear Mr. Meighen,

Your letters dated november 29th and December the lst. received . I would have liked to answer you before to day but I was busy before out Court of Appeal for the last days .

In answer to your first letter I have writen to Mr Asselin of Rimouski asking for the affidavits which you so desired. I hope to have news from him by to-morrow.

About the proofs of others statements made by Lapointe, Cannon and others in relation with your responsibility for the raid on the Guelph Noviciate I have also writen to Mr Gagnon whose answer, as soon as I get, I will send you.

Inaanswer to your second letter I have fixed for to-night a meeting with Lockwell, Audette, Moreau, Lavergne, and Royer and I will communicate to you the opinion of those gentlemen . For myself and with all deference due to the opinion expressed in your letter I believe that it would be a mistake to choose publically our candelates now . We have no press to defend our man and as soon as the candadate will have been chosen the liberal press and the liberal organization will be united to kill him, destroy his influence and annihilate his popularity . Personnaly I think that in the present circumstances it would be better to choose now our candedate in every constituency, but not to give any poflicity to that choice . It would be necessary for those men to put themselves rightaway in communications with our leaders in every parish .
