Ottawa, December 27, 1918.

Gentlemen,--

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 19th instant and of the statutory declaration of Robt. Tibball that the value of shale taken from the Kettle Point Indian Reserve is one hundred loads at twenty cents. Positive exception is taken to this rate. It is considered that not less than fifty cents per load should be accepted. If you concur, be good enough to forward a cheque for \$50.00 in payment.

With reference to the expenditure by the Township of Bosanquet of \$195.00 in repairing the road along the East boundary of the reserve, I have to request that a report of the work done and a statement, certified by the foreman, engineer, or other responsible officer, be sent here, showing in detail, for the purposes of audit, the days work, team rates per day and totals, materials, etc., etc., which make up the said sum. On the receipt of the said report and statement the payment of one-half the cost will be duly considered.
