

A. Yes, sir. It is the back part of the house I am building in Albert Park.

Q. This is a picture of the back part of the house you are building?

A. Yes, sir.

Picture is submitted to the Court, marked "Exhibit J", signed by the President and attached to the Proceedings.

Q. Now, Altenhofen, with regard to the second charge against you, when you were first charged with loss by neglect of your equipment, clothing and regimental necessaries, did you have anything to say at that time?

A. I did, sir, but I didn't know what they meant.

Q. Now, you see here some clothing. (The accused goes over and looks at the clothing on the Defending Officer's desk.) Do you recognize that clothing?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. All of it?

A. There was a number here (indicating inside of his shirt).

Q. Is that your clothing?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Will you tell the Court how it came to be here?

A. I took it home to be washed.

Q. Do you mean all this clothing?

A. Yes, sir. All this is my clothing. When I was talking to my Defending Officer, that is you, sir, you asked me about my clothing and I told you it was at home. I asked you if you would mind getting it for me.

Cross-examined by the Prosecutor.

Q. What were you doing in the year 1939 for employment?

A. In 1939 I was driving a truck and farming some of the time.

Q. Who were you driving a truck for?

A. I was driving my own truck, sir.

Q. What kind of truck was it?

A. It was a 1939 C.M.C.

Q. What type of work were you doing with this truck?

A. Just odd jobs, sir.
