Argust.—Calves have been subject of late to a form of disease about which there has been a difference of opinion. It is undoubtedly influenza, and is caused by exposure to damp and cold during an enfeebled state of the system. With care, fatality may be prevented. Warm gruel or bran, middlings or oatmeal, are of service, but a warm stable is necessary. Worms seem to be one of the last results of the disease, and are found in the air passages and in the lungs. A similar disease was found among lambs, but was cured by a little warm gruel, with a few drops of peppermint water fed to them with a spoon. The disease was prevalent among young stock in England, but readily yielded to the generous treatment we have suggested. Prevention is better than cure. Let the young stock have kind and careful treatment.
