CLINTON. A thriving incorporated
town on the Bayfield river, at the crossing
of the B & G line and the L H & B br of
the G T Ry, in Goderich township, Huron
County, 12 miles south-east of Goderich, the
county seat. Settled in 1831. It was incor-
porated a village in 1857 and as a town in
1875, and has saw, flour, woollen and plan-
ing mills, organ and fanning mill factories,
tanneries, a foundry, salt wells, etc, and
contains Methodist, Baptist, Episcopal and
Presbyterian churches, a high and a public
school, 2 banks and 3 weekly newspapers,
the *Huron News Record*, the *New Era* and
Canadian. It has a mechanics' institute
with a library of 1,700 vols, a town hall
seating 400, and telephone accommodation.
Grain, live stock and manufactured products
are shipped. Assessed valuation of real and
personal property, \$600,000; bonded in-
debtedness, \$27,500. Population, 2,900.

Canadian. Mail daily. Distance from To-
ronto 118 miles. Thomas Fair, postmaster.
