# HOMESTEAD

REGULATIONS.

even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Territories, excepting 8 and 28, which has not been home-steaded, or reserved to puride wood lots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less.

ENTRY.

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district n which the land to be taken is situate, or if the homesteader desires, e may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Com-lassioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the local agent for the district a which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to make ntry for him. A fee of \$10,00 is charged for a homestead entry.

#### HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto, to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans:—

(f) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land a each year during the term of three years.

(2) Entry must be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land is situate.

(3) If a settler was entitled to and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtain garanten may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land manned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land. The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same town, township or an adjoining or cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2), (3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestend, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

The privilege of a second entry is restricted by law to those settlers only who completed the duties upon their first homesteads to entitle them to patent on or before the 2nd June, 1889.

Every homestender who falls to comply with the requirements of the omestead law is liable to ave his entry cancelled, and the land may e again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

should be made at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent, or the Homestead Taspector. Before making application 'or patent, the settler must cive six months' notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands, at Ottawa, of his intention to do so.

### INFORMATION.

Newly arrived immigrants will receive at the Immigration Office in Winnipeg or at any Dominion Lands Office in Manitoba or the North-West Territories.
