Pennsylvania has 1,100,000 dairy cows, which are owned by 211,000 individuals. They make on an average 140 lbs. of butter annually, which on the basis of 18c. per lbs, would net owners over \$25 per year per cow.

There are 2,333 entries of live stock for the Birmingham Show of the Royal Agricultural Society (June 20 to 24), as compared with 2,688 at Manchester last year, 1,885 at Leicester in 1896, and 1,703 at Darlington in 1895. At the Birmingham meeting there will be 709 entries of horees, as compared with 981 at Manchester last year; 792 cattle, as compared with 821; and 182 pigs, as compared with 185 at Manchester.
