

“for ascertaining what persons have rights in the Commons of *Berthier* and *Isle du Pads*,” be now read the first time.

The Bill was accordingly read the first time; and ordered to be read a second time, to-morrow.

On motion of Mr. *Street*, seconded by the Honorable Mr. *Cameron (Peel)*, Ordered, That the Bill from the Legislative Council, intituled, “An Act further to amend the Charter of the Bank of *Upper Canada*,” be now read the first time.

The Bill was accordingly read the first time; and ordered to be read a second time, to-morrow.

The House resumed the adjourned Debate upon the Amendment which was, on Tuesday last, proposed to be made to the Question, That Mr. Speaker do now leave the Chair (for the House again in Committee of Ways and Means), and which amendment was, that all the words after “That” to the end of the Question, be left out, and the words, “This House, while prepared to make adequate provision for the Public Defence, for the maintenance of the Public Credit, and for the efficiency of the Public Service generally, deem it inexpedient, in view of the probable early consummation of the Confederation of the British North American Provinces, an event which will render necessary a comprehensive revision of the Commercial Legislation of all the Provinces, now to adopt measures which will have the effect of unnecessarily disturbing the Trade, the Manufacturing industry, the Currency, and the Banking system of the Province,” inserted instead thereof.

And the House having continued to sit until after Twelve of the Clock, on Friday morning;
