

SATURDAY, January 22, 1825.

THE House met pursuant to adjournment.—PRAYERS.

By Order, Mr. *Mabey* carried to his Majesty's Council, the Bill intituled "an Act to repeal certain parts of an act intituled an Act relating to Treasons and Felonies," for their concurrence.

The *Attorney General* moved for leave to bring in a Bill intituled "an Act for the relief of Michael Burke, an Insolvent Debtor, which on Motion, received the first reading.

On Motion, the said Bill received the second reading.

On Motion of the *Attorney General*, the Bill intituled "an Act to limit and ascertain the jurisdiction of Justices of the Peace in matters of Small Debt," received the second reading.

On Motion the House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House, to take into consideration the said Bill,

Mr. Speaker left the Chair,

The *Attorney General* took the Chair of the Committee,

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair,

The *Attorney General* Chairman of the Committee reported, That they had made a progress in the Bill, and that he was directed to move that they may have leave to sit again. Ordered accordingly.

The Honorable *Robert Gray*, Colonial Treasurer, sent to the House, by Mr. *Robert Gray*, the Public Accounts, from the 31st August 1820, to the 21st January 1825.

On Motion, it was ordered, That a Committee be appointed to meet a Committee of his Majesty's Council for the purpose of inspecting the Public Accounts: Mr. *Campbell*, Mr. *Cameron*, Mr. *Mabey*, Mr. *Hodgson*, and Mr. *Owen*, were appointed for that purpose.

Adjourned to 12 o'clock on Monday.

MONDAY, January 24, 1825.

THE House met pursuant to adjournment.—PRAYERS.

Mr. *Cameron* moved that a Committee be appointed to prepare the heads of a Bill to prevent the importation of base copper coin, and for regulating the payment of coppers throughout this Island. Ordered accordingly: and that Mr. *Cameron*, Mr. *Hodgson*, and Mr. *Owen*, be appointed a Committee for that purpose.

The *Attorney General* moved for leave to bring in a Bill to be intituled "an Act to prevent the using or riding horses without the permission of the owner," which on Motion, received the first reading.

The *Attorney General* gave notice, that he would bring in a Bill to be intituled "an Act to prevent the using or taking away boats, flats, or canoes, without the consent of the owners."

Mr. *Mabey* moved that the Bill to repeal an Act made and passed in the thirty-sixth year of his late Majesty's Reign, intituled "an Act to prevent disorderly persons from taking and riding or using

the horses of others without their leave or permission," receive the second reading.

Mr. *McNeill* moved as an amendment that the said Bill receive the second reading this day six months: and the question being put on the amendment, the House divided,
