Kitchener Goes Down Amid Fearful Scenes

London, June 15-Details of Londen, June 15—Details of some of the incidents on board the British cruiser Hampshire just before she sank off the Orkneys last week, causing the death of Field Marshal Earl Kitchener, are given in an official statement issued tonight based on statements by the dozen survivors of the cruiser who were washed ashore on a raft: "From the report of the 12 survivors of the Hampshire," says the statement, "the following conclusions were reached:

Settles at Once.

"The Hampshire was proceeding along the west coast of the Orkneys. A heavy gale was blowing and seas were breaking over the ship which necessitated her being partially battered down. Between 7.30 and 7.45 p.m. the vessel struck a mine and began at once to sattle by the bows, heeling over to starboard, before she finally went down, about freen minutes after.

"Orlers were given by the Captein for all hands to go to their established stations for abandoning ship. Some of the hatches were opened and the ship's company went cuickly to their stations. Efforts were made, without success, to lewer some boats. One of them was broken in half and its occupants were thrown into the weater.

Some Died on Rafts.

"Large numbers of the crew had life-saving vessels and waistcoats, which proved effective in keeping them afloat. Three rafts were safely launched, and, with about fifty to seventy men on each, got clear. It was daylight up to about eleven. Though rafts with these large numbers of men got away, in one case, out of over seventy men aboard, only six survived. The survivors all report that the men gradually dropped off even died aboard the rafts from exhaustion and exposure to cold. Some of the crew must have perished in trying to land on the rocky coast after such a long exposure. Some died after landing."

The London Daily Mail publishes the following account of the loss of the Hampshire by a leading seaman, Rogerson, one of the Hampshire's survivors. "Of those who left the ship and have survived I was the one who saw Lord Kitchener last. He went down with the ship; he did not leave her. I saw Captain Savill help his boat's crew to clear away his galley. At the same time the Captain was calling to Kitchener to come to the boat, but owing to the noise, made by the wind and sea, Lord Kitchener could not hear him. I think when the explosion occurred Lord Kitchener walked calmly from the Captain's cabin, went up the ladder and on to the quarter-deck. There I saw him walking quite collectively and talking to two officers. All three were wearing khaki and had no overcoats on. Lord Kitchener calmly watched preparations for abandoning the ship which were going on. The crew just went to the stations, obeyed orders and did their best to get out the boats, but it was impossible owing to the rough weather.

France to Borrow \$100,000,000 In United States.
